## **Dairy Enterprise Development**

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#### **Project Background**

This project is targeted towards increasing self- sufficiency in dairy products vis-a-viz milk, butter and cheese, and reducing dependency on the import of livestock products and in doing so, helping reduce the negative balance of trade. With high demand and easy adoption of dairy farming; it provides a great opportunity to encourage young farmers to take up on a commercial scale. Under this initiative, with the government providing a space for quick implementation of the projects on the ground, the unemployed youth can not only be gainfully engaged and improve their own lives but they would also contribute significantly to the nation's effort to achieve food security.

#### **Project Objectives**

The broad objectives of these initiatives are to:

- Accelerate domestic dairy production to substitute import and ensure affordable dairy products for all
- Boost income of the farmers and youths to enhance their livelihood
- Encourage and gainfully engage youths in dairy farming as an enterprise
- Strengthen post- production, value addition, cold chain facilities and market facilities
- Gear towards attaining self- sufficiency in dairy products and product diversification with value addition (yoghurt, Cream, ghee, paneer etc...)

#### **Project Strategies**

The main strategy for implementation of these initiative is to enhance domestic dairy production and import substitution through:

- Smart and mechanized commercial farming
- Initiation and promotion of value addition of surplus milk



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- Bank concept storage and post production facilities in strategic locations.
- Engagement of unemployed youth groups in the whole dairy value chain.

#### **Project Goals**

With establishment of dairy farms and post production facilities following benefits are expected

- Import substitution of milk.
- · Economic stability of farmers through the enterprise
- Increase per capita consumption of milk
- Generate direct employment to youths in farm operation and also in post-production facility, retail outlets and processing facilities.

#### **Major Components of Project**

- To enhance domestic production and to realize import substitution, the project will establish new or upscale 4 farms of 10-20 cow level (commercial level: >10 cow level specified in RNR cost-sharing mechanism) to fully operational mode, at all times to come.
- Upscale the domestic production of milk to meet the dietary requirement of 250 ml milk per day to every population in the dzongkhag by end of 12th five-year plan (2023).
- Ensure easy, cheap and affordable dairy products to the consumers and stabilize market price.

#### **Project Support**

 The Dzongkhag Livestock Sector shall guide the proponent in development of proposal



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- The Dzongkhag Livestock Sector shall facilitate in establishment of farms and activities
- The Dzongkhag Livestock Sector shall facilitate youth proponents in availing loans from financial Institutions under different schemes like CSI and PSL
- The Dzongkhag Livestock Sector shall facilitate in supply of inputs
- The Dzongkhag Livestock Sector in collaboration with the line agencies under the Department of Livestock shall provide technical backstopping and guidance wherever required
- Capacity building of youth farmers with provision of 21 days hands-on training on dairy farm management, estimating Unit Cost of Production (UCOP) and economic analysis of the farm to ensure the business viability of the farm.
- Link farms to the market (BLDCL)
- The fund support as per the RNR Cost-Sharing Mechanism (CSM) shall be provided as detailed below.

#### Scope of the Work

With the engagement of youth groups/enterprising Individual entrepreneurs in the dairy enterprise, more commercials farms can be operationalized and set as an exemplary model farms in the dzongkhag.



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#### **Key Deliverables**

- Expected engagement of youth in dairy farming enterprise: Minimum of 3 Youths/farm
- Expected milk Production from the farm: 40,000 Litres milk in one production cycle (0-270 days) from 20 cows
- Net Income from the farm: Nu. 0.4-0.5 million annually per farm and should increase over the years
